ily declining to 28 companies engaged in		
raw material extraction in 2019.		
It can be seen that there is a tendency for		
the number of companies and the num-		
ber of men and partly women who are		
engaged in raw material extraction in		
Greenland, to follow each other. 84 com-		
panies and with 289 men and women		
with main employment in raw material		
extraction when it peaked in the year		

2011, and followed roughly each other by		
declining number of companies and num-		
ber of workers in raw material extraction.		
Number of companies and job opportuni-		
ties tend to follow each other.
