Consultation response to drafts of the EIA and SIA reports concerning Nalunaq Gold Mine Project (Nanoq – ID: 23767046)

The Greenland Police thank you for sending the consultation case for our review. The Greenland Police have reviewed both drafts with interest.

The Greenland Police have no comments on the draft of the EIA report.

The Greenland Police have the following comments on the SIA report:

Please note that entry to Greenland from a country that is not a member of the Schengen cooperation generally will require entry via an approved border crossing point, where the police carry out border control. This also applies to persons who are going to leave Greenland to a country that is not included in the Schengen cooperation. An overview of currently approved border crossing points can be found at the Ministry of Immigration and Integration's site. Overview of travel documents, visa conditions and border crossing points can be found on the following website: <https://www.nyidanmark.dk/en-GB/Words-and-concepts/US/Visum/Overview-of-Travel-Documents,-Visa-Conditions-and-Border-Crossing-Points>.

This will, for example, apply in the following situations, if the entry is from, or the exit is to, a country, that are not part of the Schengen cooperation:

- Page 12, second top paragraph: "*The majority of the equipment to be delivered to the construction site will be transported by ships and landed on the beach*".
- Page 19, last half of top section: "*Exported foreign workers will be flown to and from Greenland in a rotation system. They are transported directly to the area from Narsarsuaq*".
- Page 60, 5.7.8: "*During the operation phase, a much smaller amount of goods is expected compared to the construction phase. Most of it will consist of consumables for mining and processing. It is expected that the goods will be collected in South Greenland and brought regularly in and out of the site. The gold concentrate from the flotation plant will also be shipped by barge and transported away from the mine. It is expected that approx. 3,000 tons of gold concentrate annually will be shipped from the mine to a shipping port in South Greenland, from where the concentrate will be shipped for further processing outside Greenland.*"

In addition, the following is noted:

- Page 107, lower section: It should also be described in the section that the Greenland Police is the authority in Greenland that handles border control in accordance with the Schengen cooperation.
- Page 171 and 172, pkt. 9.1: It is noted that Greenland Police's annual statistics from 2019 are used as basis for the assessment. Greenland's Police's latest annual statistics can be found on

the following website: <https://politi.gl/statistik-og-udgivelser/aarsstatistik>. The annual statistics for 2023 are currently being prepared and are expected to be issued around 1 March 2024.
